

Resin Workspace Cleanup Guide

Cleaning Silicone Cups:

- Let leftover resin fully cure inside the silicone cup.
- Once cured, squeeze the cup to loosen the resin.
- Peel the cured resin out in one clean piece.
- If resin remains, turn the silicone cup inside out.
- Use painter's tape to lift remaining cured flakes.
- If needed, wash the cup with warm water and mild dish detergent using your hands.

Cleaning Plastic Stirring Sticks:

- Clean plastic sticks while resin is still liquid.
- Spray a paper towel with isopropyl alcohol.
- Wipe the stick thoroughly until clean.

Cleaning Silicone Stirring Sticks:

- Option 1: Let resin cure and peel it off.
- Option 2: Wipe with alcohol while resin is still liquid for immediate reuse.

Cleaning Silicone Mats:

- Allow spilled resin to fully cure.
- Peel cured resin off the mat.
- Use painter's tape to lift small pieces.

Cleaning Resin Molds:

- Never use alcohol or acetone on silicone molds.
- Let leftover resin fully cure.
- Peel out cured resin.
- Use painter's tape for stubborn bits.
- Wash with warm water and mild dish detergent if needed.

Cleaning Liquid Resin Spills:

- Use isopropyl alcohol on safe surfaces.
- Use acetone only on surfaces that will not be damaged by it.
- Avoid acetone on painted or coated surfaces.
